Admission Policy of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University

The Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University was established to produce researchers, educators and highly specialized professionals who possess high-level medical and life-science knowledge and analytical skills.

OAdmission Policy of the Doctoral Course in Medical Sciences

The Doctoral Course in Medical Sciences was established to foster researchers, educators and highly specialized professionals who possess a wide range of medical and life-science knowledge, profound analytical skills and international research competency in their expertise. The course also aims to foster experienced medical doctors with research-oriented, problem-solving skills. With these aims, the Course seeks applicants who meet the following criteria.

- 1. Those who have the enthusiasm and humanity to contribute to the future of medicine and life sciences in Japan and around the world, and who possess the ability to do so through education and research.
- 2. Those who wish to interact with people in Japan and other countries through research and develop world-leading research in the field of medicine and life sciences.
- 3. Those who have the enthusiasm and ability to engage in research in medicine and life sciences as a working adult.
- 4. Those who have achieved a high level of basic scholastic ability in fields other than medicine, and desire to engage in education and research related to medicine and life sciences, or to contribute to society.
- 5. Those who aim to become highly specialized professionals in the fields such as AIDS research, developmental biology and regenerative medicine, metabolic and circulatory informatics, and health and longevity medicine.
- 6. Those who conduct both cancer research and clinical oncology practice, and aim to become oncologists or certified physicians related to cancer care.

Features of the Curriculum

The education at graduate schools of medicine in Japan so far has aimed to nurture educators and researchers through medical research. In recent years, however, the research environment has changed, and lifestyle-related diseases have become a larger clinical concern than acute diseases. In addition, post-genome research has also been demanding from basic science to disease-related research.

In order to meet these trends, we set a second objective and principle for the Graduate School of Medical Sciences at Kumamoto University in order to educate "research-oriented medical professionals". In accordance with the idea, we have developed new educational programs that enable students to acquire interdisciplinary and extensive medical knowledge and cutting-edge clinical skills, while cultivating a research-oriented mindset. At the same time, we have drastically revised our existing curriculum so that students can acquire not only extensive medical knowledge as well as advanced research skills through their tutorials.

We have also re-organized our four-major system into a single major system (Major of Medical Sciences). While the former four-major system categorized into basic, clinical and social medicine, the new system includes the joint supervision of research among multiple fields. The reform of the educational system and its programs are the most ambitious since the establishment of Graduate School of Medical Sciences at Kumamoto University in 1955. We are confident that our new programs are highly innovative in accordance with the national standards.

With these reforms, we will satisfy the need to foster research-oriented clinical doctors, as well as educators and researchers at an international level. With the enthusiastic support of young medical students from across Japan, we are committed to becoming one of the best institutions in terms of medicine, meeting the needs of the new era.

<u>1. Qualifications for Application</u>

Applicants should meet any of the following qualifications from (1) to (9).

- (1) Those who have graduated from a university or are expected to graduate by March <u>2026</u> (completing a medical, dental, pharmacy (a 6-year course of study) or veterinary medicine course).
- (2) Those who have been designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Notification No. 39 of the Ministry of Education, 1955) as either of the following:
 - ① Graduates of the National Defense Medical College established under the Defense Agency Establishment Law (Law No.164, 1954).
 - (2) Those who have completed a master's course or a course prepared by a professional graduate school or are expected to receive a master's degree, and those who have enrolled for at least two years in a doctoral course which is not divided into two parts (first two years and second three years), and acquired at least 30 credits, received necessary research guidance (including those who meet the requirements of the Academic Degree Rule [Section 1, Article 6, Ordinance No. 9 of the Ministry of Education, 1953] before it was partially revised by the ordinance of the Ministry of Education [Ordinance No. 29, 1974]) and are regarded as having the academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a graduate of a medical, dental, veterinary or pharmaceutical science course (whose major purpose is to cultivate practical clinical skills) of a graduate school or of an advanced course of other school. (Refer to Note 1 below.)
 - ③ Those who are university graduates (of other courses except medical, dental, veterinary and pharmaceutical science courses [whose major purpose is to cultivate practical clinical skills]) or have been engaged in research work for at least two years at a university or research institute after completing 16 years of school education abroad and are regarded as having the academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a university graduate of a medical, dental, veterinary or pharmaceutical science course (whose major purpose is to cultivate practical clinical skills) of a graduate school or of an advanced course of other school. (Refer to Note 1 below.)
 - (4) Those who have taken a medical or dental course at a medical or dental department of a university established under the former School Education Act (Imperial Decree No. 388, 1918) and graduated from the said department.
- (3) Those who have completed, or are expected to complete by March 2026, 18 years of overseas school education. The most recent course completed must be in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or veterinary medicine.
- (4) Those who have completed, or are expected to complete by March <u>2026</u>, 18 years of overseas school education (the most recent course completed must be in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or veterinary medicine) by means of completing a correspondence study of the said country in Japan.
- (5) Those who have completed, or are expected to complete by March <u>2026</u>, the academic curriculum of a foreign university located in Japan and authorized by its home country as an educational institution (whose graduates are regarded as having completed 18 years of school education in their home country (the most recent course completed must be in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or veterinary medicine)) and designated as such by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
- (6) Those who have been awarded, or are expected to be awarded by March 2026, a degree equivalent to bachelor's degree by completing five years or longer curriculum (limited to curriculums in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or veterinary medicine) at a university or school in a country other than Japan (limited to educational facilities whose general education/research activities have been accredited by a person authorized by the government of the foreign country or its related organizations, or facilities designated by the ministry as equivalent to the above-mentioned educational facilities) (including the completion of a correspondence course implemented by a foreign school while living in Japan, and the completion of a curriculum at an educational facility certified under the educational system of a foreign country and designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, and Technology).
- (7) Those who are acknowledged as having academic ability equivalent or superior to that of a university graduate (limited to those in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy (six-year) or veterinary medicine) as a result of admission qualification screening conducted for individual applicants by the Graduate School, and are 24 years old or older as of March 31, <u>2026</u>. (Refer to Note 1 below.)
- (8) Those who have been enrolled in a university (majoring in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy (6-year course) or veterinary medicine only) for at least four years and are regarded as having earned credits designated by Kumamoto University with excellent grades. (Refer to Note 1 below.)

(9) Those who have completed 16 years of school education in a country other than Japan (The most recent course completed must be in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or veterinary medicine, which also applies to other provisions in

the paragraph), completed 16 years of a overseas school education by completing a correspondence course while staying in Japan, or completed a curriculum at an educational facility in Japan certified under the educational system of a foreign country and designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan as having overseas education curriculums (only when applicants who are regarded as having completed 16 years of school education offered in the foreign country) and acquired the number of credits with outstanding academic performance specified by Kumamoto University. (Refer to Note 1 below.)

Note 1: Those who intend to apply under the qualification of (2)-2, 3, (7), (8), and (9) must undergo a preliminary qualification screening prior to the application. Contact the Student Affairs Office of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences for necessary documents. Please follow the procedures shown on P8 for the application for the preliminary qualification screening. (Except for the applicants who have completed a master's course or a course offered by a professional graduate school)

Note 2: Only foreign nationals can apply for the "International students entrance examination for admission in April 2026."

If the applicant's home university is not certified by the above organization, the applicant should meet any of the Qualifications for Application other than (6). In that case, preliminary qualification screening may be required.

Notes:

- 1. International applicants must list all previous schooling in the personal history section of the Entrance Application Form.
- 2. If applicants wish to have their English ability evaluated based on the score of approved English proficiency examination, they must submit a copy of any one or more of the TOEFL-iBT (score should be 40 or higher), TOEFL-PBT ,TOEFL-ITP (433 or higher), TOEIC (L&R), TOEIC-IP (477 or higher), or IELTS (5 or higher), which should have been taken within two years before the entrance examination. Applicants are allowed to submit a latest score report (both original and copy) on the entrance examination day as well. When applicants submit more than one score report, or when they take the English test (TOEFL-ITP) on the day of the exam in addition to submitting a score report, the highest score will be referred for evaluation.

TOEFL-ITP and TOEIC-IP scores are valid only when they are from the tests conducted at Kumamoto University.

Applicants whose English test scores are close to the above minimum requirements are advised to take the TOEFL-ITP on the day of the entrance examination, as the results of the entrance examination will be evaluated on an overall criteria including English.

- 3. When required certificates are written in a language other than Japanese or English, they must be submitted along with a Japanese translation. (This requirement does not apply to Japanese Government Scholarship students.)
- 4. When the applicant's current name differs from those on the issued certificates due to a change of family name, etc., an official copy of part of the family register should be attached to the certificates.
- 5. Applicants should inform the Student Affairs Office of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences if they need their original transcripts or certificates of (expected) graduation returned later.

(4) Remarks:

- ① Applications will be rejected if the entrance examination fee is not paid by the deadline or the "Certificate of Payment" is not affixed on the "Sheet to affix the Certificate of Payment of Examination Fee" as required.
- 2 The entrance examination fee is not refundable except in the following cases:
 - (a) When the applicant has paid the entrance examination fee but has not completed the application procedure (i.e., has not submitted the application documents or the application has not been accepted).
 - (b) When the entrance examination fee has been paid more than once in error.
 - ③ Bank transfer fees for refunds are the responsibility of the applicant.

- 1. The academic ability test composes of an English ability test (TOEFL-ITP) and an interview about your reasons for application and your research plan.
- 2. Dictionaries are not allowed in the English test.
- 3. For overseas applicants, the oral exam (interview) will be conducted online or on campus. Before applying, they should consult thoroughly with their prospective supervisor at the Graduate School of Medical Sciences regarding their application.

OTuition

Tuition is 267,900 yen per semester for a total of 535,800 yen per year. (See Note 2 below.)

- (Notes) 1. Information regarding the payment method of the enrollment and tuition fees will be provided by e-mail together with the enrollment guidelines, as well as the guidelines for tuition exemption.
 - 2. If the tuition fee is revised, the new tuition will be applied from the time of the revision.

8. Scholarship

[For Japanese students]

Students can apply for the scholarship of the Japan Student Services Organization for the First-class Scholarship (choices are from the monthly loan of 80,000 yen or 122,000 yen) or the Second-class Scholarship (choices are from the monthly loan of 50,000 yen, 80,000 yen, 100,000 yen, 130,000 or 150,000 yen) depending on the screening result.

Students can also apply for scholarships offered by the local governments and private organizations.

9. Entrance Fee Exemption/Postponement and Tuition Fee Exemption

Those who meet the qualifications for entrance fee exemption/postponement and tuition fee exemption, if approved based on the screening of their applications, will be exempted from paying the full or half amount of the entrance fee or will be allowed to defer payment of the full of the entrance fee, and will be exempt from paying the full or half of the tuition fee.

Applicants who meet both the academic and household criteria will be selected within the University's budget, in order from those with the highest level of household financial need.

The academic criteria for the entrance and tuition fee exemption requires that the applicant's result of the entrance examination should be above the standard set by the graduate school to which he/she belongs. The academic criteria for the postponement of entrance fee payment requires that the applicant should have passed the entrance examination of his/her graduate school.

The entrance/tuition fee exemption will not be granted to those who do not meet the academic criteria above, even if they are in a situation of high household financial need.

Students from households that are unable to pay the entrance and tuition fees due to the death of their financial provider or the damage to the student or their financial provider caused by a natural disaster within one year prior to enrollment will be exempted from paying the entrance fee and full or half of the tuition fee if their application for exemption is approved. (In the case of a half tuition exemption, the payment of the entrance fee can be postponed for a certain period of time.)

10. Application for the International House (For International Students Only)

Applicants who wish to accommodate in the International House after admitted must apply before the announcement of examination results as below. The permitted living period is up to a half year in principle. Please be noted that there may be no vacancy and that those who have not passed the entrance examination are not entitled for the accommodation.

11. Notes

- (1) Revision of the content of the application documents and refund of the entrance examination fee are not acceptable once they are received.
- (2) Applicants who have made false statements in the submitted documents will be disqualified for the entrance examination. Admission may be cancelled even after enrollment.
- (3) If applicants do not receive the Admission Card for Entrance Examination by August 1, 2025, they should contact the Student Affairs Office of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences. The Admission Card must be brought to the entrance examination and must be kept until the results of the examination are notified.

Enrollment Guide

Years of Study Required for Completion and Method of Taking Courses

1. Day and Evening Flex Course

In accordance with the special measures for education prescribed by the Article 14 of the Standards for Establishment of Graduate School, the University offers day/evening flex courses to working students, which enables them to attend classes and receive research guidance not only during the day but also at night.

Students can take classes scheduled in the 4th, 5th, and 6th periods on Monday through Friday on their convenience and can also use their days off from work, national holidays, summer and New Year's holidays, or their long leaves.

Students can receive guidance on the research topics in which they can utilize their achievements from work.

The computer network is also available to students when they receive research guidance for the preparation of their dissertation.

2. Long-Term Student

If students wish to complete the doctoral course in a longer period of time (up to eight years) than the normal period of study (four years) due to work commitments, they may apply for and be approved after an evaluation. Students who use this system are called "long-term students," and the total amount of tuition fees is the same as for students who complete the course in the normal term of study (four years). For more details regarding this system, please contact the Student Affairs Office of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences shown in the table of contents.

3. Degrees

- (1) Students can earn either a doctoral degree in medicine or life sciences depending on their coursework and dissertation.
- (2) The above-mentioned degree is awarded only to the students who have attended the Graduate School for four years or longer, acquired at least 30 credits, and passed dissertation evaluation and examination. Students who have accomplished excellent research achievements require at least three years of study.
